

CCF Human Rights Competition – Video

Theme: It is Important to Vote

Rules and Guidelines

The Citizens' Constitutional Forum calls on creative individuals to express their understanding on the importance of voting by producing a short video that highlights their own understanding of the importance of taking part in the democratic process – Voting.

What to film?

Anyone with a digital device that can capture and edit video is welcome to submit their clip that should have a maximum duration of 1 minute, and it must reflect the theme, “It is Important to Vote.”

Participants are free to be creative with the style of their video. It can be a video that:

- has an individual speaking clearly and directly to the camera
- contains text and /or a voice over
- an animated video produced by software
- a short-film that reflects the understanding of the theme of the video competition

All submissions must incorporate some versatility by combining texts, images and sound that allows for a good flow of captivating content.

The contest is open to interested individuals.

What are the rules of the video competition?

- Applications are open to Fiji residents from the age of 14 and above. All eligible participants under the age of 18 must provide signed consent from parent or legal guardian – proof of consent must be uploaded to the provided online form.
- All entries must be submitted in English
- Entries that contains hate speech, explicit content and the use of vulgar language will automatically be disqualified



- Entries must not include or show persons who are under the age of 18 without prior written consent of their parents or legal guardians.
- CCF has the right to publicize the winners through the use of media.
- Video entries will be utilised by CCF for advocacy, publications and organizational activities on the organisation's platforms. Producers will be credited accordingly.
- Due to COVID-19 developments around the country, CCF will not be accepting hand delivered submissions. **Participants must strictly follow COVID-19 safety guidelines as specified by the Ministry of Health.**

What is the marking criteria?

- All entries must be an original digital video with a message linked to the theme of the competition
- In adhering to official COVID-19 Ministry of Health advisories, we highly encourage submissions be made by individuals to avoid contact with people outside the safety of your bubble.
- Maximum duration of the clip should be no more than 1 minute.
- No copyrighted material (music, images, etc.) may be used for this contest unless you own the copyright or have a license to use the material.
- No banners or slogans of political parties should be used in your production.

How do I submit my video?
